

# Sun Safe



As the weather starts to warm up it is important for us to abide by the 'No Hat Play in the Shade Rule'. Hats should be worn outside at all times.

If your child does not have a hat they will be asked to play under the COLA – sandpit and play equipment. Please assist us by ensuring your child has their hat each day and it is clearly labelled with their name.

Caps are not to be worn. Applying sunscreen in the morning before school is also a great idea and sunscreen is available at school. Hats can be purchased from the office.

### Water

The weather is warming up and drinking water is very important. All students MUST have a water bottle in their school bag every day! We are still unable to use our bubbler system due to COVID-19 restrictions, however we can fill up water bottles for our students.

Attendance at school every day is a vital part to your child's educational development. We appreciate at times that your child may be unwell to attend school, but, non-attendance that includes

shopping, haircuts, and long weekends impact your child's learning. The NSW Department of Education attendance policy states that all students should attend 90% of the time.

As you can see, our attendance is at 85.3% overall. At the moment, we only have 50% of our students attending school above 90% of the time. For Term 4, let's have a final push to bump our attendance rate to 90%. We are here to support your child and family to ensure they reach their educational outcomes.
