We then took on learning for the rest of the day, with full bellies and full hearts.


















Ed Week | Picnic and Games

Attendance

As you all know, attendance is vitally important for your child to thrive at school.

Throughout 2023 we will be working closely with all families to improve their attendance. We are aiming to reach our system target for 2023, which is to increase the proportion of students attending >90% of the time.

Currently we are sitting at 65.2% which is well below our target. Every day is vitally important to be a school, if your child is away, please ensure you are using the Schoolstream app to notify the school.



NSW DoE Core Rules

The department of education has core rules that all students are expected to follow:

Students are expected to:

- Attend school every day, unless they are legally excused, and be in class on time and prepared to learn. Maintain a neat appearance, including adhering to the requirements of the school's uniform and dress code policy.
- Behave safely, considerately and responsibly, including when travelling to and from school.
- Show respect at all times for teachers, other staff and helpers, including following class rules, speaking courteously and cooperating with instructions and learning activities.
- Treat one another with dignity and respect
- Care for property belonging to themselves, the school and others.



School Communication

In 2023, we will continue to use SchoolStream as our main form of communication with our families. Due to some changes and requirements of all DoE schools, we, much like most schools, will be implementing the use of Sentral this year. Sentral includes a parent portal in their programme. This will be utilised later on in the year to replace SchoolStream. We will keep you updated on this throughout the year.

SchoolStream will be used to send out any information and updates such as school closures, permission notes, uniforms orders, school



events and student absences. We ask that you ensure you have this app downloaded, an account created and your notifications turned on. We also encourage all adults in your family to utilise this app.



Facebook will be used to share school celebrations, share success and promote positive stories about Carcoar Public School. Facebook will also be used to post anything urgent. Please like our page!

If you have any concerns or feedback regarding school communication please share your thoughts so that we can continue to improve our ways in which we communicate.

- It is a multiple or repetitive post by a single user
- It is a repetitive post copied and pasted or duplicated by single or multiple users
- It contains anything else that the school deems inappropriate and does not align with our values, standards, policies and guidelines of the Department of Education.

EMERGENCY PLANNING AND ARRANGEMENTS DURING THE UPCOMING BUSHFIRE SEASON

Dear Families and communities.

I am writing to advise you that our school is in a bushfire prone area and is identified as Category 2 on the NSW Department of Education's bushfire risk register.

As a community user of our facilities, it is important that you know what to do in an emergency and have a plan in place. This is a requirement of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011.

During the school term, when the NSW Rural Fire Service declares a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating for Carcoar Public School, the NSW Department of Education's policy requires the school to temporarily cease operations for the following day. This means the school will be non-operational on these days. The school will inform the school community after 4 pm if there is a change to the operational status of the school for the following day.

In addition, schools may be made non-operational due to changing higher risk conditions and advice from Emergency Services and the State Emergency Operations Centre.

We recommend that you download the <u>Parent App</u> and select to monitor advice from our school which will push notifications to you advising that the school is non-operational. We also recommend that you stay up to date with bushfire and grassfire activity by using the <u>Hazards Near Me</u> app (set a watch zone for your school area), and by monitoring local media. You can also review fire activity and alert levels on the RFS website.

It is important that you undertake appropriate planning and monitor bushfire conditions during the bushfire season and be ready to act when required.

Bushfire danger period information for parents and carers



Factsheet

This factsheet provides information for parents and carers about arrangements for the bush ire danger period.

The NSW Department of Education has engaged external experts to conduct assessments of all NSW government schools, to identify schools at greater risk of impact from bushfires.

To support the health, safety and wellbeing of students and staff, the department, in consultation with NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS), will direct the school to temporarily cease operations on days when a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating has been declared for your school's NSW fire area. Alternative learning arrangements will be put in place for these days.

Schools may be directed by the department to become non-operational at any time based on advice from emergency services and the State Emergency Operations Centre.



What is a Fire Danger Rating?

Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a fire start. The ratings are determined by a combination of factors including air temperature, relative humidity, wind speed and drought.

When will I know if my child's school has been made non-operational?

At approximately 4:00pm each day the Fire Danger Rating is issued for the following day. This means that schools, including onsite preschools, will be notified after school hours that it will be non-operational the following day. Your school will notify you as soon as possible by the preferred method of communication.

Parents and carers are requested to:

- provide up-to-date home and after-hours contact details to your school
- stay up-to-date with news and local media through the bushfire danger period.

What education arrangements will be in place if the school is nonoperational?

When non-operational, your school will advise of alternative learning arrangements, including any relocation or learning from home plans.

Works notification | 25 July 2023

Dear staff and parents/carers.

We are replacing the vinyl tiles at Carcoar Public School in a storeroom in Building B. This work will involve working with asbestos containing material within the glue under the vinyl tiles.

The storeroom is being safely used at present as the vinyl tiles are undisturbed.

The storeroom will be cordoned off before the work starts, and safety measures and monitoring put in place.

Work to remove the vinyl tiles will take place after school hours between Thursday 10 August and Friday 11 August 2023.

Work will be done in accordance with SafeWork NSW regulations and the NSW Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan. All work will be completed by licensed and accredited asbestos contractors and monitored by occupational hygienists in strict accordance with all applicable legislation, regulations, policies, and guidelines.

The storeroom will be inspected by an independent hygienist to confirm it has been fully remediated, and the school will receive a clearance certificate before the storeroom is reopened.

The health, safety, and wellbeing of the school and the local community is our highest priority.
