School Uniform Requirements | 2024

The Department of Education requires that schools set local school uniform requirements and supports the wearing of school uniform, which promotes a sense of belonging for students and creates a positive identity for the school community. School uniforms also contribute to the personal safety of students by allowing easier recognition of students inside the school and in the community.

Carcoar Public School expects students to wear the uniform during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when engaged in school activities out of school hours. All students should have the opportunity to access the full range of school activities, including physical activities, while wearing a school uniform. Girls must have the option to wear shorts and pants.

The school has two types of uniforms:

All uniforms are stocked at the school and supplied to you at cost price. Please contact the school regarding the tartan.

Our school's response to a student not wearing uniform is appropriate, fair and consistent, and a student cannot be suspended or expelled for not wearing school uniform. A student will be issued with 3 warnings before a formal letter is sent home. We do however understand that sometimes issues arise with uniforms, please contact the school so we are aware of this. It is at the Principal's discretion for making exemptions for not wearing a uniform, if considered appropriate after discussions with families.

Wellbeing & Behaviour Policy 2024

Carcoar Public School Rules

Students are expected to:

- Not interrupt the learning of others
- Be in the right place at all times

New South Wales Core Rules

The NSW Department of Education also has core rules that all students are expected to follow:

Students are expected to:

- Attend school every day, unless they are legally excused, and be in class on time and prepared to learn.
- Maintain a neat appearance, including adhering to the requirements of the school's uniform and dress code policy.
- Behave safely, considerately and responsibly, including when travelling to and from school.

- Show respect at all times for teachers, other staff and helpers, including following class rules, speaking courteously and cooperating with instructions and learning activities.
- Treat one another with dignity and respect
- Care for property belonging to themselves, the school and others.

Celebrating Positive Behaviour

All students at the beginning of the school year are placed on blue level. Each fortnight staff will hand out merit cards to reflect a range of school achievements and work towards achieving a higher recognition during their schooling.

4 Merit Cards	=	1 Blue Award
4 Blue Awards	=	1 Yellow Certificate
4 Yellow Certificates	=	1 School Banner

Value Certificates are not included in the above positive award system.

Consequences for Inappropriate Behaviour

All students at the beginning of the school year are placed on blue level, if students demonstrate poor choices, they will be issued an orange card and placed on a level. Students are given three orange warnings before being placed on a red level. The Principal has the discretion to place a student on a red level if the behaviour warrants that.

Warning letters/cards are given to students if they choose not to follow school rules. We expect the letter to be taken home and given to families and returned the following day signed by the family and student.

This will be utilised later on in the year to replace SchoolStream. We will keep you updated on this throughout the year.

SchoolStream will be used to send out any information and updates such as school closures, permission notes, uniforms orders, school



events and student absences. We ask that you ensure you have this app downloaded, an account created and your notifications turned on. We also encourage all adults in your family to utilise this app.



Facebook will be used to share school celebrations, share success and promote positive stories about Carcoar Public School. Facebook will also be used to post anything urgent. Please like our page!


If you have any concerns or feedback regarding school communication please share your thoughts so that we can continue to improve our ways in which we communicate.
